Postdoctoral Fellowship in Qualitative Research and Suicide Prevention among 2S/LGBTQIA+ communities

Professor Olivier Ferlatte from l'École de santé publique de l'Université de Montréal and the Centre de recherche en santé publique (CReSP) is seeking candidates for a full-time postdoctoral fellowship position as part of Pride Talk, a research project funded by the Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR).

About Pride Talk

Pride Talk is an innovative study aimed at creating and evaluating an online suicide prevention training for 2S/LGBTQIA+ communities. Based on gatekeeper approaches, this training will support the development of the necessary skills for 2S/LGBTQIA+ individuals to support their peers in suicidal crisis and guide them to appropriate services. Inspired by the tradition of peer support within 2S/LGBTQIA+ communities, this initiative seeks to equip individuals to significantly impact their communities.

The postdoctoral fellow will be responsible for conducting qualitative analyses to identify the essential components of the intervention to be developed and to understand the peer support experience within 2S/LGBTQIA+ communities. They will join a pan-Canadian team of experts in 2S/LGBTQIA+ health and suicide prevention, working together to create a lasting and positive impact on the lives of 2S/LGBTQIA+ people in Canada.

Join Qollab

The fellow will be welcomed into <u>Qollab</u>, a dynamic research lab led by Olivier Ferlatte. Qollab is distinguished by its community-based and participatory research approaches, aiming to advance knowledge on mental health and substance use issues within 2S/LGBTQIA+ communities.









Key Responsibilities

- Supervise and perform qualitative data analyses;
- Produce research reports and scientific publications;
- Mentor students and research staff;
- Participate in scientific activities and meetings related to the Pride Talk project;
- Contribute to the writing of grant applications related to the project.

Ideal Candidate Profile

- Holds a Ph.D. (or has submitted their doctoral thesis) in one of the following fields: Public Health, Psychology, Sociology, Sexology, or a related discipline;
- Possesses strong skills in qualitative methods and data analysis;
- Demonstrates interest or expertise in community-based and participatory research;
- Has excellent communication and writing skills (proficiency in both French and English is an asset);
- Has knowledge of issues related to suicide prevention and/or mental health;
- Has experience supervising students;
- Shows interest in or has experience in research involving 2S/LGBTQIA+ individuals;
- Can work independently and demonstrates academic productivity.

- An academic writing sample from the past two years;
- Doctoral transcripts (if applicable);
