



Postdoctoral Fellowship – Infectious Disease, Qualitative Research

An international research team (Dr. Kate Zinszer, University of Montreal; Dr. Valéry Ridde, IRD; and Dr. Mrittika Barua, Brac University) is inviting applications for a postdoctorate research fellow with a PhD in qualitative research, training in infectious diseases and/or public health, and field research experience in population health intervention research in LMICs. We are seeking a dedicated and highly motivated Fellow to join our interdisciplinary research team for a dengue project based in Dhaka, Bangladesh. This position involves extensive field work and includes conducting a realist evaluation.

Qualifications

Required

- PhD in global health, public health, urban health, or a closely related field
- Demonstrated expertise in qualitative research methods and social science
- Experience in conducting field work in LMICs and Asia
- Experience working in multidisciplinary global health research projects
- Strong publication history
- Canadian or French residency/citizenship
- Experience in research project coordination is an asset

Terms

Funding is for one year and renewable for a second year with the expectation to apply for external funding. Salary will be competitive with the candidate's skills and experience; \$50-\$60,000 CAD. The position will be based in Dhaka, Bangladesh.
